QUESTIONS & RESPONSES

Will accommodations be made for the hard of hearing?

Yes. We will work with our sound and acoustics sub-contractors to address the needs of the hard of hearing.

Can greeters help people cross the street?

That's a great idea, yes greeters can help people cross the street.

Are we selling the houses when we sell the church?

Yes, we will sell the houses the church owns, most of the proceeds will be used to pay off any remaining debt owed on the property.

Are the sanctuary spaces accessible?

Yes. One sanctuary will have fixed pews with cutouts for accessible seating on several rows toward the front. Also, there will be an accessible ramp to the altar.

The other sanctuary has flexible seating and one level. Additionally, there is an elevator up to the choir loft. The loft will be tiered with steps, but the back row will be accessible.

How much parking will be available?

There will be approx. 270 spaces on the lot to the northwest of our new site on Sundays, and approximately 100 spots on weekdays. Additionally, there will be handicapped parking on our lot, as well as Day School/CRE parking and drop-off and a loading dock for Community Resource Bank and Church needs. We also plan to reach out to PSO about an agreement similar to our current agreement with Bank of Oklahoma for the spots directly west of the lot. We currently have 160 spaces.

How big is Fellowship Hall?

It will be twice as big as Emerson Hall. We currently accommodate 140 at tables, new space will accommodate 287.

Will there be elevators?

Yes, there are several elevators throughout the property, including a large elevator down to the Children's Religious Education wing for groups of people, strollers, etc.

Are the architects local?

Yes! Selser Schaefer is a premier Tulsa firm, involved with many projects downtown.

Will there be a choir room?

Yes. There will be a state-of-the-art choir room to celebrate and unify our fully-graded choir program.

Will there be a room for kids to be active?

There will be a toddler-PreK playground, as well as a playground for older children. There will also be a large motion room similar to our current Presidents' Room.

Are there provisions for future expansion?

Expansion space is very limited, however there are a few possibilities if needed. However, we are doubling our size and designing with our future in mind.

Is there a "safe space" weather room?

We are not building a FEMA shelter, but we have designated spaces that will have thickened walls to protect against high winds.

How much bigger is it than our existing site?

The new building will be approx. 70,000 sq. feet. Our current building is approx. 47,000 sq. feet.

Is there worship space for The Point, the Humanist Hour?

Yes. The Humanist Hour will take place in the modern sanctuary.

Will there be a Memorial Garden?

Yes. A Memorial Garden and columbarium are in the plans for our new home.

How are we handling the Memorial Garden transition?

We plan to move some physical earth, and some plant clippings, from our current location to the new garden. We will also have opportunities for individuals or families to participate in re-consecration ceremonies.

Will the building be sustainable?

Our architects and their consultants have worked extensively on sustainable projects. We will build to the highest level of sustainability that is possible given site and cost constraints.

How long will I have to pay my pledge?

You can pay your pledge over a period up to 5 years.

How much will this project cost?

\$30 million dollars, which includes furniture, equipment, and fixtures. The sale of the land will go toward this, but we do not yet know what we will realize for this property.
